
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#### KINDNESS GOES A LONG WAY

## **2024 / 2025 STATISTICS**


During the 2024-25 school year, CIS case managed **794 students across Wayne County.** Of those students,

88% improved academics 96% improved behavior 91% improved attendance

3,795 Basic needs items were provided to both case-managed and non-case-managed students county wide.

53.9% Clothing/shoes 4.8% Hygiene products 35.3% Food 6% School supplies

**71,278 Tier 1 (schoolwide) supports were provided.** This number includes both case-managed and non-case managed students. **5,302 Tier 2 and 3 supports were provided to case managed students**.
